Dear SJRS Families,

As we approach the end of the quarter, I strongly encourage everyone to log into RenWeb to check your student's grades, if you have not already done so. There should be no surprises on report cards. The elementary school teachers will be in direct contact with parents about scheduling conferences with them. Since we have so many students in the middle school for conferences this year, we have adjusted our schedule. **We will NOT have school on November 10 to give us the entire day for conferences.** Also, we will be sending out an email with a Google Form link to all middle school parents to indicate their availability for conferences, and then we will be scheduling those. We appreciate everyone's patience with scheduling as we are happy to be getting back to in-person, face-to-face conferences this year.

For the past eight years or so, I've encouraged our graduating SJRS 8th grade class to develop their own clubs, ideas, and events that will be special for them and their classmates. Several of the past few 8th grade classes have told me that we should have a mascot and have made suggestions. I'm not surprised that our students have picked the smartest bird for our mascot. I've also been known to collect crow merchandise over the years, so that might have something to do with it too....

TENNIS PROGRAM

I am excited to announce that I will be conducting an elementary and middle-school age tennis program at the Keene Racquet Club (KRC). This will start Friday, November 5 to



January 14 (not including December 24). Elementary school age (8 to 10 years old) will be held on Fridays from 3-4:30pm. Students will meet at the gym and then ride together in the school van.

Middle school age (11 to 13 years old) will be held on Saturdays from 3-4:30 pm. A free-play day will also be available for same-skill-level play on Sundays, also at 3-4:30pm. Parents will need to drop and pick up their child at the tennis club on these days. KRC is located on Martell Court, Keene, past Agway and before the American Gymnastics building.

I have tennis racquets and balls available so no other added expense is needed for sports equipment. However, nonclub member participants are required to at least have a Junior Membership.
