1:45pm -- Trunk-or-Treat Halloween Parade

The parade will start inside, exit out the playground door, proceed through the parking lot, and re-enter the building at the main front doors. A few faculty vehicles will be decorated and distributing candy by Leadership Council members. Parents are welcome to attend the parade. The parking lot is the perfect place to gather and watch. Parents may bring candy to distribute, if they wish.



2:00-2:30pm -- M&M Bingo in the gym. (No food in the gym this year.) Preschool and Kindergarten will be in their classrooms.

2:30pm -- Students return to classrooms. Students may stay in their costumes for dismissal.

A few notes to help you plan accordingly.

* Elementary students will have a special snack in the morning. Parents should keep an eye out for emails from the teachers or class parents regarding donations of snacks/drinks for each of the classes.

*Students in grades PK-5 should bring their Halloween costumes to school with them. They should not wear their costumes to school that day. One exception: If hair color is to be worn as part of the costume, it must be applied at home and must be washed out before the next school day. Students may not apply hair color at school.

* Students in grades 6-8 will be helping with bingo, but not in costume.
