UNIFORM POLICY REMINDERS

Please note the following reminders for our uniform policy.

Shoes: Clean comfortable shoes or sneakers in good condition. No slides, crocs, sandals, or work boots. For safety, shoes must have closed fronts and backs with no "platform" style heels and soles. Sneakers must be regular sneakers without wheels.

For girls: No plaid skirts, kilts, or jumpers. Girls may wear plain front, khaki or Navy Blue pants/chinos or Bermuda length shorts (warm weather months) with a belt. (K-2 may wear pull-on/elastic waist khaki or Navy Blue pants). Girls may wear a plain khaki or Navy Blue skort that reaches below the fingertips when standing. Navy blue leggings or tights may be worn under skorts during cold weather months.


NHDI YEAR-LONG PROGRAM

Rise and shine...and dance! We have once again partnered with New Hampshire Dance Institute (NHDI) to bring the NHDI Year-Long Program to our students for this school year!

The program is open to all students in grades 4-8. All are welcome! No previous dance experience is required. Classes will be held in the gym every Tuesday morning, 7:20-8:10am. It is a perfect way to start the day! The NHDI teaching artists love to get moving early!

Tuesday, September 16, will be a SAMPLE class. All interested students in grades 4-8 are invited to attend.

Students may try this first class to see what it is like prior to officially registering for the program for the year.

Our Back-to-School Nights are great opportunities to meet our new administration, find out what your child's classes will be like, and get to know our faculty. KidSight is a FREE vision health-screening program carried out in local schools and day-care centers. Keene Lions Club

volunteers provide equipment and technical assistance as needed. The effectiveness of this program is recognized by local eye doctors and by members of the Dartmouth Health/Cheshire Medical Center Pediatrics Department.

Students in Preschool, Kindergarten, Grade 1, Grade 3, and Grade 7 will be screened. If you have a concern about your student who is in another grade, you may have them screened as well. 


Our annual GOLF TOURNAMENT is coming up!
